6. For the comfort and convenience of the students it has been proposed that a tin shade should be laid down on exam enquiry window.
7. Plan to celebrate Youth Fest.
8. Plan to organize alumni meet with the discussion to the office bearers of alumni association.
9. To organize various cultural and academic activities in different departments through the departmental societies.
10. For the overall development of students a strong communication between the parents and the college is essential. For this purpose an interactive meet with the parents is proposed.

**FINAL OUTCOME OF THE ACTION PLAN FOR THE  
SESSION 2017-2018**

The following achievements were obtained during the session 2017-2018:
